AVTEC-ANTHC successfully team taught the August and May Water Treatment classes. Both courses were very successful and the curriculum revisions and updates that were made after the August training had the positive impact as was hoped. Pictures attached.

Total number of students trained was 26. Fourteen in the first class and twelve in the second class. All participants gained knowledge in water plant operations, including water filtration, backwashing, efficient boiler operation and maintenance, pipe repair, chemical mixing, and safety. The course mixed class room lecture with hands on demonstrations and actual functioning boilers and water treatment filtration system. The curriculum was completely upgraded in April 2014.
