The Grantee will provide training to 10 in school participants ages 16 - 24 in the construction trades. The training will give participants experience in planning and designing a construction project. The participants will gain experience in the proper and safe use of construction tools and will be trained in youth employability skills.

The training will consist of introducing participants to the construction trades by using the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) training books. Each student work with various small wood working projects, to gain familiarity with wood shop equipment and carpentry tools.

The participants will receive youth employability skills training and will receive and be introduced to career pathways through the career fair which is held each year. The

participants will complete one semester class and will receive a certificate from the NCCER. The participants will be experienced in drafting, planning and actual construction of a small building.

4 students have been participating in planning and designing a construction project. The participants have gained experience in the proper and safe use of construction tools and have been trained in youth employability skills.

The training has consisted of introducing participants to the construction trades by using the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) training books. Each student has worked with various small wood working projects, to gain familiarity with wood shop equipment and carpentry tools.

The participants are working on the first semester class, participants are expected to earn their certificates with the continuation of the class in the spring. The participants have also gained experience in drafting, planning and actual construction of a small building.

Instead of a "one day" career fair, we had representatives from various occupations visit with students to discuss career options. We also had university representatives, AVTEC representatives and professionals visiting students, including the carpentry students. Students were also provided the opportunity to take career surveys to help determine their aptitude for certain careers as well as requirements for the career. Finally, students were involved in a careers study class where they participated in the WorkKeys, the Alaska based online system used to assess students career readiness.
