

A. INTRODUCTION

Throughout this Amendment, these entities are referred to as follows:

Igiugig Village	=	Village
Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Division of Environmental Health and Engineering	=	DEHE
Denali Commission	=	Commission
Indian Community Development Block Grant	=	ICDBG

On May 25, 2010, the ANTHC and the Igiugig Village executed Cooperative Project Agreement (CPA) to procure and ship construction materials for a new health clinic.

This project was originally funded with \$500,000 from ICDBG FY10 and \$204,808 from IHS Equipment Funds FY10.

The project has previously been amended as follows:

Amendment No. 1 to the CPA in July 2010 added \$1,445,875 to the project as follows: \$466,011 from Amendment 12 to Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award No. 00185, dated May 19, 2010; \$660,857 from Project Authorization 1174-D, dated June 9, 2010; and \$319,007 in matching funds. This additional funding was added to the project to cover the amended project scope. The scope was revised to include construction of the health clinic. This includes site preparation, materials and equipment, construction, and labor.

Amendment No. 2 to the CPA in August 2011 decreased M-CB by \$45,674, decreased M-CM by \$10,000, and increased M-CL by \$55,674. These changes were necessary to cover the unforeseen costs of bringing the well that serves the clinic up to project specifications in terms of flow rate, water treatment and water quality and safety testing. The project scope and funding as revised in Amendment No. 1 did not change.

B. RECOMMENDED CHANGES

In order to complete the scope of this project, the following changes are necessary:

TO: IHS NEPA Determination

Federal funding for this project requires an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) uses the Indian Health Service (IHS) environmental review procedures as outlined in the Environmental Review Manual, issued in January 2007. Current IHS policy (Federal Register, Vol. 58, No. 3, January 6, 1993, pp. 569-572) allows for categorical exclusion of actions and construction activity that do not have a significant impact on the environment.

The original scope of work for Project AN 10-GL9 was to procure and ship construction materials for a new health clinic. Amendment No. 1 revised the scope to include construction of the health clinic. This includes site preparation, materials and equipment, construction, and labor. The original environmental review also covered the complete scope of Amendment No. 1.

The Denali Commission concurred with ANTHC's recommendation that Project No. AN 10-GL9 be categorically excluded from further National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review on February 8, 2010. This amendment shifts funds between phase codes in the cost estimate table without revising the scope. The environmental impacts reviewed are within the scope of the original document and consistent with current regulations. No additional environmental review is necessary at this time.

ANTHC will revisit this environmental review to determine if potential environmental concerns have been addressed if the scope of work changes.
