The Alaska State Historic Preservation Office (AK SHPO) has reviewed the subject project (received December 2, 2011) pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. Following our review of the proposed project as well as the accompanying *Trip Report* provided by Erin Ryder, we concur that a finding of **no historic properties affected** is appropriate for the subject project.

As a reminder, should inadvertent discoveries of cultural resources (historic, prehistoric, and archaeological sites, locations, remains, or objects) be encountered during the construction of the proposed boat launch ramp & dock, the resources will need to be evaluated for eligibility for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places (36 CFR 800.4) and the nature of project effects on any eligible historic properties will need to be assessed (36 CFR 800.5). Efforts to avoid, minimize or mitigate adverse effects to such properties will need to be resolved in consultation with our office (36 CFR 800.6).
