

***1. Scope of Work***

Funding in the amount of \$2,000,000 is awarded to the Yuut Elitnaurviat, the People's Learning Center of Bethel to complete the Dental Health Training Facility project through the Denali Commission. The scope of work for this project includes the completion of the interior build-out and Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment (FF&E) for the dental training facility located on the Yuut Elinaurviat campus in Bethel, Alaska. Total project cost for this scope of work is \$5,580,000. Direct management of this project through local competitive bid process shall be managed by the Yuut Elitnaurviat.

Due diligence for this project has not yet been completed and expenditures are authorized when the following conditions have been met:

1. An approved business plan using the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) business plan template. The business plan shall demonstrate that operations of the program are sustainable as well as maintenance of the facility. Three (3) copies and one (1) original of the business plan and attachments should be submitted to the Denali Commission office by November 30, 2007 for review. Upon review of the business plan, additional documentation may be requested by the Commission.
2. Match funding sources for this project are as follows:
  - a. The Economic Development Administration (EDA) in the amount of \$2,000,000
  - b. Legislative funds from the State of Alaska in the amount of \$1,580,000. This funding is a direct grant from the State of Alaska to the Denali Commission for this project. This funding will have the same requirements however will be funded through a separate award agreement.

The Denali Commission shall convene with the EDA and State of Alaska to coordinate the funding processes for this project. This includes joint review of business plan submission and strategic project management decisions. Each funding agency's requirements will be discussed and coordinated by the funding partners with the goal of streamlining processes. All efforts will be made to assure the project is moved forward in a timely manner however all agency requirements must be met.

Once all due diligence requirements have been met, written authorization to proceed with the scope of work in this grant agreement will be provided by the Denali Commission to the Yuut Elitnaurviat. Any work completed prior to this documentation may not be authorized for reimbursement.

All Commission funding is intended for use for the scope of work identified in the Award document only. Any balance of funds remaining after the full scope of work has been completed will be returned to the Denali Commission.

## **2. Milestones**

The following milestones are identified as the major steps to be completed as part of the project. "Planned" dates for the first milestone are included here. As part of each progress report, recipients shall update the progress toward meeting these milestones (see section 7, Reporting).

## **3. Award Performance Period**

The Award performance period is November 1, 2007 through September 30, 2009. It is expected that construction is completed by June 30, 2009 and that a one-year warranty period will follow. All funding should be expended by construction end date; however closeout will begin at the end of the warranty period. The performance period is the period during which Award recipients can incur obligations or costs against this Award.

## **4. Direct and Indirect Costs**

## **5. Budget and Program Revisions**

## 7. Reporting

- a. **Progress Reports** shall be submitted on a quarterly basis. The first reporting period is November 1, 2007 thru December 30, 2007 and quarterly thereafter. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. Progress reports shall include the following:
  - i. Total project funding, including both Denali Commission funding and other project funding sources.
  - ii. The total project expenditures for the project as of the end of the reporting period, including both Denali Commission and Other funding sources.
  - iii. Updated schedule and milestone information as identified in the Scope of Work.
  - iv. Narrative summary of the project status and accomplishments to date, any problems, overruns and delays, including any type of litigation related to the project, and address the following questions: is the project on schedule, is the project on budget, and what actions are planned to address any project problems.
  - v. **Construction Projects** Photographic documentation of project progress shall be provided with the progress reports for active construction projects. The photo documentation shall include a minimum of three, dated photos per reporting period such that a complete record of the construction is maintained over time, from "before," showing the situation before the start of construction, to "during" showing work proceeding on the project, and "after" to show the finished project. Photos shall be provided in a digital format as part of the on-line report. A short description of the activity and names of those in the photos shall also be provided.
- b. **Federal Single Audits** shall be submitted annually, when required. In accordance with OMB Circular A-133, which requires [subpart 200] "Non-Federal entities that expend \$500,000 or more in a year in Federal awards shall have a single or program-

specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of this part [subpart 205]. The determination of when an award is expended should be based on when the activity related to the award occurs.”
